Accreditation Cycle – update

The Accreditation Subcommittee is always working and reviewing accredited terms, processes and associated documentation so that the standards set out by Australian Medical Council (AMC) and the Medical Board of Australia (MBA), in relation to accredited terms, are met in the Tasmanian health service setting. Over the last six months there have been new terms approved for intern cohort and International Medical Graduates (IMGs) at the Launceston General Hospital (LGH) and many of the terms which required 12 month reviews are being actively considered to ensure that the standards and requirements for accreditation are met.

The AMC as the accreditation authority for the medical profession, under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law is reviewing its responsibilities for assessment and review of junior doctors in training wellbeing through its accreditation standards and processes. Patient and intern safety will also be a focus and a working party has been formed to consider the information available and determine a way forward.
