

GP Registrars in the Hospital Setting

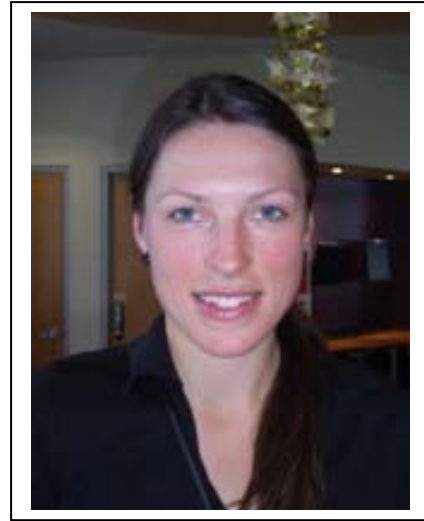
The first two years of General Practice training can be undertaken by JMOs working with the NWAHS.

This part of the training is hospital based and both the Mersey Community Hospital and the North West Regional Hospital have accreditation with RACGP and ACCRM for a number of hospital terms.

During this time the GP Registrars' training needs are supported by the Colleges.

As well, as JMOs employed by the NWAHS the responsibility for overseeing education, supervision and pastoral care rests with the PMCT.

The PMCT has strong role in securing accreditation for these terms on behalf of the NWAHS
