Accreditation Cycle – update

The Accreditation cycle for all of the hospitals in the Tasmanian Health Services have been completed and the intern (and all RMO) terms have been updated. The PMCT has moved to a four-year accreditation cycle and the terms have been approved for four years unless otherwise specified.

The feedback from the health services and the survey teams has indicated that the process was well received and the PMCT would like to thank all who contributed to the survey visits.

GP terms approved for interns in Tasmania

At the meeting of the PMCT Accreditation Subcommittee on 21 November 2017, the Subcommittee extended the accreditation of five (5) intern terms at locations of Flinders Island General Practice and Ochre Medical Centre, Queenstown, Huon Valley Health Centre, Huonville, King Island General Practice and Ochre Medical Centre, St Helens to 31 December 2018 so that feedback on the terms can be fully evaluated.

Those who undertake the terms are urged to provide feedback so that the PMCT Accreditation Subcommittee can review the accreditation of these new terms in the Tasmanian health setting. GP terms will be evaluated by June 2018.
