Mid-cycle review of accredited terms in Tasmania

The Mid-cycle review of all intern and PGY2+ terms in Tasmania is underway.

The first review was completed in late 2019 for the North West Regional Hospital-Mersey Community Hospital. This review was most successful as Interns and Junior Doctors provided excellent feedback using the SurveyMonkey feedback process in relation to the terms they undertook which allowed the survey team to identify issues as well as positives.
